The

Federal Government rolled out the Federal Intervention in Indigenous communities in the Northern Territory on the basis of pornographic material being available in those communities. It branded Aboriginal males, en masse, as being social deviants. Why would the Government allow the liberalisation of censorship laws on the one hand, and continue to brand Indigenous people deviants for accessing pornography on the other. Either pornography is wrong for all, or the Federal Government must apologise to the Indigenous communities which have been humiliated by their Intervention.

I would contend that pornography is wrong, and it is wrong for everyone, not just our Indigenous communities. The laws should be tightened, not liberalised.
