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> An anomaly in taxation law which seems to discriminate against working beyond

> 65 lies in redundancy payments. If a person works beyond 65 and is then offered a redundancy payment, that payment is taxable. An offer, made under identical circumstances, length of service etc, to another employee aged under 65 is not taxable. This would seem to encourage people to take an offer earlier than they might be otherwise inclined because they know that if they reject a first redundancy offer and continue to work then they will be tax penalized in the event of some future possible redundancy.
