Abolish X18+ category but keep other existing classification categories. Any film with explicit sex should be Refused Classification. No R18+ classification for computer games because the violence in these games is harmful.

Better liaison between relevant parties concerned.

Where there are criteria in common - yes.

Anything RC, X18+ or R18+ should be prohibited to general users.

Perhaps review it to see if more should be refused classification.

Q26:

Yes, consistency is important, and that's up to government.
