Recruiting for Legal Officers and Senior Legal Officers Financial Services Inquiry

The Australian Law Reform Commission (ALRC) is an independent Commonwealth statutory agency that undertakes law reform inquiries referred to it by the Attorney-General. The ALRC is based in Brisbane.

The ALRC is recruiting for a number of legal officers at the Senior Legal Officer (EL1) and Legal Officer (APS 5-6) levels for the Financial Services Inquiry. These positions may be offered as ongoing/non-ongoing and the ALRC will consider full-time and part-time appointments.

A law degree is essential for all positions as is a demonstrated understanding of Chapter 7 of the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth). A post-graduate degree is highly regarded.

Key responsibilities of the positions:

- Assist the President and Commissioners to undertake inquiry work
- Contribute to the writing of ALRC consultation papers and final reports;
- Contribute to formulation of law reform recommendations;
- Undertake detailed legal research to inform the ALRC's understanding of the field under inquiry using a range of research tools;
- Organise and participate in consultation meetings with stakeholders and prepare briefing and consultation notes;
- Critically analyse and synthesise submissions and other research materials.

1. A current CV;
2. A Statement of Claims against the Selection Criteria for each position; and
3. Applications in PDF format only, with the file name to be Surname_first name-position.pdf (position – SLO and/or LO).
