#### THE SCHOLARHSIP

For an outstanding candidate with a demonstrable track-record in research into financial regulation and financial regulatory theory: a stipend of \$29,863 per annum, indexed for inflation, tax free, for  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years, plus full fee waiver.

- To contribute to the work of an existing inter-institutional research cluster comprised of leading scholars in the field of financial regulation from UOW, USyd, Griffith and QUT
- To undertake a thesis addressing the work to date, and findings of, the current Australian Law Reform Commission Inquiry into a Review of the Legislative Framework for Corporations and Financial Services Regulation
- Thesis topic to be negotiated, but can include the UK/ RSA "Treating Customers Fairly" regime; principles-based, outcomes-determined regulation; plain English drafting; other aspects of the 2018 Banking Royal Commission which speak directly to the ALRC Inquiry; etc.
- Must be willing to include an internationally comparative perspective
- Must have a Bachelor's degree, with a preference for candidates with an LLB/JD
- Preference for candidates with a Master's degree and who have a track record of publications
- Must be an Australian citizen or permanent resident and willing/able to attend campus on certain occasions

- Prepare a one-page motivation statement, motivating why you should be awarded this scholarship
- One-page potential thesis topic
- One page CV (list of publications excluded from this page limit)
