I am a member of the public and part of the religious school/s community. I hereby wholly denounce the Australian Law Reform Commission review to change the Anti-Discrimination Act to accommodate for "LBGTQI+" in religious schools and/or institutions on the following grounds:-

- 1. It is my right to practice my culture, language and religion. My child does not belong to the "LBGTQI" community and it does not make any sense why you would want my child. Unless of course it is because you can not get all adults to accept the "LGBTQI" and children are being used to get the point across.

- 5. With proposed laws like this, it is pure discrimination against those with religious beliefs and forces children and adults to comply. - 7. Changes to the Act could ostracise many families from all religions and backgrounds. Why do you want to take our children?
- 8. The law should be balanced to allow me to continue my rights and uphold my dignity.
