Three key matters: <u>Efficacy</u>, <u>efficiency</u> & <u>fairness</u>

What does the ideal future acts regime look like?

 - A government body?
 - Representing an exploration company?




What are 'future acts'?

A 'future act' is an act that affects native title:

- extinguishes native title; or
- is wholly or partly inconsistent with the continued existence, enjoyment, or exercise of native title rights and interests.

Common examples are:

- Mining or exploration tenements
- Compulsory acquisition
- Pastoral leases
- Water licence



Why is reform needed?

1998:	Today:
 5 determinations that native title exists 	 530 determinations that native title exists
 7 Prescribed Body Corporates 0 Registered Indigenous Land Use Agreements 	 285 Prescribed Body Corporates 1520 registered Indigenous Land Use Agreements

Native title law is **complex**

The system is expensive and difficult to use

Native title holders sometimes do not **get enough say** in the process


Resourcing is a big issue



Our key ideas for reform


Reformed statutory procedures

Procedures aligned with the impact of future acts on native title.




Agreement-making

Promoting fair and equitable agreements.



Native Title Management Plans

A plan that PBCs can make to explain what they would like to happen on Country.





Future acts by category?

It is overly complex and ambiguous

future act


Fixed in time, doesn't consider new and emerging industries Inconsistent

Misalignment: impact of the future act and the rights

- Future acts and **primary production** (Subdivision G)
- Management of water and airspace (Subdivision H)
- Renewals and extensions (Subdivision I)
- Public housing etc (Subdivision JA)
- Reservations, leases etc (Subdivision J)
- Facilities for the public (Subdivision K)
- Low impact future acts (Subdivision L)
- Acts passing the freehold test (Subdivision M)
- Acts affecting offshore places (Subdivision N)



What is the impact of the future act?



<u>Impact-based characterisation:</u>

- Nature of the future act, geographical size, or its duration
- Long-term effects of the future act
- Location of the future act (eg site of cultural sensitivity or exclusive native title)




Right to consultation, right to negotiation



Consultation

- Exchange information and seek views
 - Consider those views
- Where possible, respond to those view
- **Engagement** between the parties to minimise impact of the future act




Negotiation

- Exchange information and seek views
- Consider those views, adjust proposal
 - Exchange of draft agreements
 - Bargaining and compromise
- Reach agreement about how the act is done

Reformed Right to Negotiate

- Applies to higher impact future acts
- Parties are encouraged to negotiate agreements early
- New right to object for native title party
- NNTT arbitration process assists when negotiations are not progressing






Making agreements fairer

Conduct standards:

promoting better practice in negotiations



Content standards:

things that **must** or **must not** be in an agreement

Resolving disputes:

What happens when people don't do what they agreed to do?

Transparency:

Should there be greater transparency about agreement terms?


Expanded standing instructions:

Making agreements less costly and more widely available




Native Title Management Plans
