For us, we were very fortunate to meet our wonderful surrogate and really had no difficulties with regards the actual pregnancy and birth. However, other difficulties were initially meeting our surrogate; navigating the process across states (different legislation); and finalising the change in birth certificate following the parentage order, as the state our son was born in was not

Yes, however, this is dependent on the type of surrogacy arrangement. In our case, the embryo was genetically ours, and as such we should have been legally recognised as our sons' parents

Increased awareness - many people we spoke to did not realise surrogacy was legal in Australia. Increased oversight (access to) surrogates, as outside of family members being surrogates, Facebook appears to be the main way of meeting a surrogate, which has its risks
