7. What needs to be improved about surrogacy for Australians?

Consistent laws across all states.
For tasmanians - to be able to access surrogates from other states. Tasmania has a small population and therefore there are considerably less options for potential surrogates. Additionally, willing family members could live in other states.

8. In Australia, surrogates and donors are not allowed to be paid. What do you think of that?

I think they should be compensated for the things that cannot be physically measured and offered payment for this. Things like wear and tear on the body, time and energy spent on the process and being pregnant, going through the challenges of birthing, and any disruptions to their own family life. I think payment should be legal.
