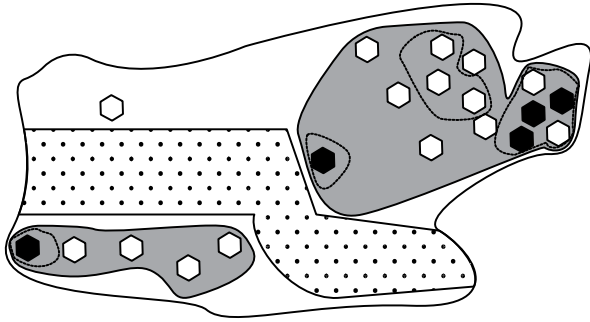


Review of the Future Acts Regime: Native Title Plans

The Australian Law Reform Commission has published its Final Report for the Review of the Future Acts Regime, *Fulfilling the Promise of Mabo: Reforming the Future Acts Regime in the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth)*. The Final Report contains 86 recommendations to reform the future acts regime

This information sheet sets out a summary of the reform that the ALRC calls **Native Title Plans**. These recommendations are found in **Chapter 13** of the Final Report.

A self-determined pathway to validity



- Sacred site (public)

- Non-sensitive area

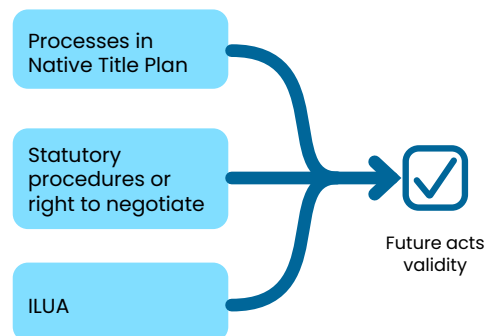
Native Title Plans would be a tool for PBCs to set out their **preferred processes and conditions** for future acts.

They could also deal with **other matters**, such as identifying preferred cultural heritage processes or setting out a 'catalogue' of services the PBC may provide.

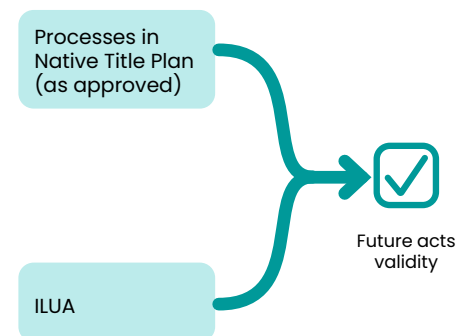
Recommendation 82
